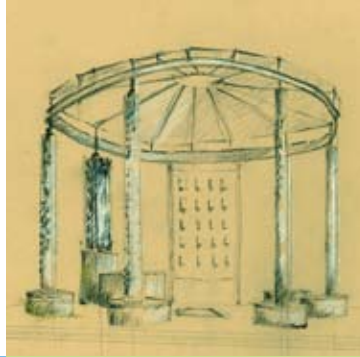

Driving directions from Center City:

Take 16th Street north past Fairmount Avenue. Turn left at Ridge Avenue. Continue on Ridge past Girard Avenue to 23rd Street. Turn right on 23rd and drive for two blocks. St. Elizabeth’s Community Center will be on your right. On-street parking is available on 23rd Street.
